Freedom Area High School is dedicated to the development of an effective Transition Program to prepare our young people for productive and satisfying adult lives in the competitive global marketplace. The Freedom Area High School's Transition Program is designed to assist "ALL" students to be successful in their academic and career paths. The Transition Program is based on individual student's needs, taking into account each student's strengths, preferences, and interests. Services/Programs offered to assist students to identifying their goals and strengths through the Transition Program include, but are not limited to:

- Focusing on improving academic and functional achievement to support post-school goals
- Interagency support
