Treating Others w/Respect

- When someone else is talking, we should be ***looking & listening.***
- General No-no's:
 - No name calling
 - Do NOT touch others or their “stuff”
 - Do NOT talk about others unless it is a nice comment
 - Do NOT laugh at others
- As a general rule, we do not question our teachers or talk back to them.



Bullying/“Joking” w/Others



- Most bullying incidents are viewed by students as “joking” or “messing with” others. However, we sometimes fail to realize the impact our jokes have on others.

If someone is bullying or “upsetting” you, tell the nearest adult immediately. If it continues, report it to our counselors and Mr. Hernandez.

Doing OUR Best, At ALL Times

- As Principal, my two biggest expectations of you are:

Cafeteria Expectations

- Cutting in line is NOT permitted. Students that cut will eat last.
- When you are done eating, you should clean your area of the table. When you leave the cafeteria, be sure to **push in your seat**.

General Rules & Expectations

- 3) Food and drinks are NOT permitted outside of the cafeteria w/o an approved medical note.
